**MODEL:** "Do you realize that we go through this every time we go out?—junk ourselves up with covering after covering of stuff that's all going to be waste in time anyway."

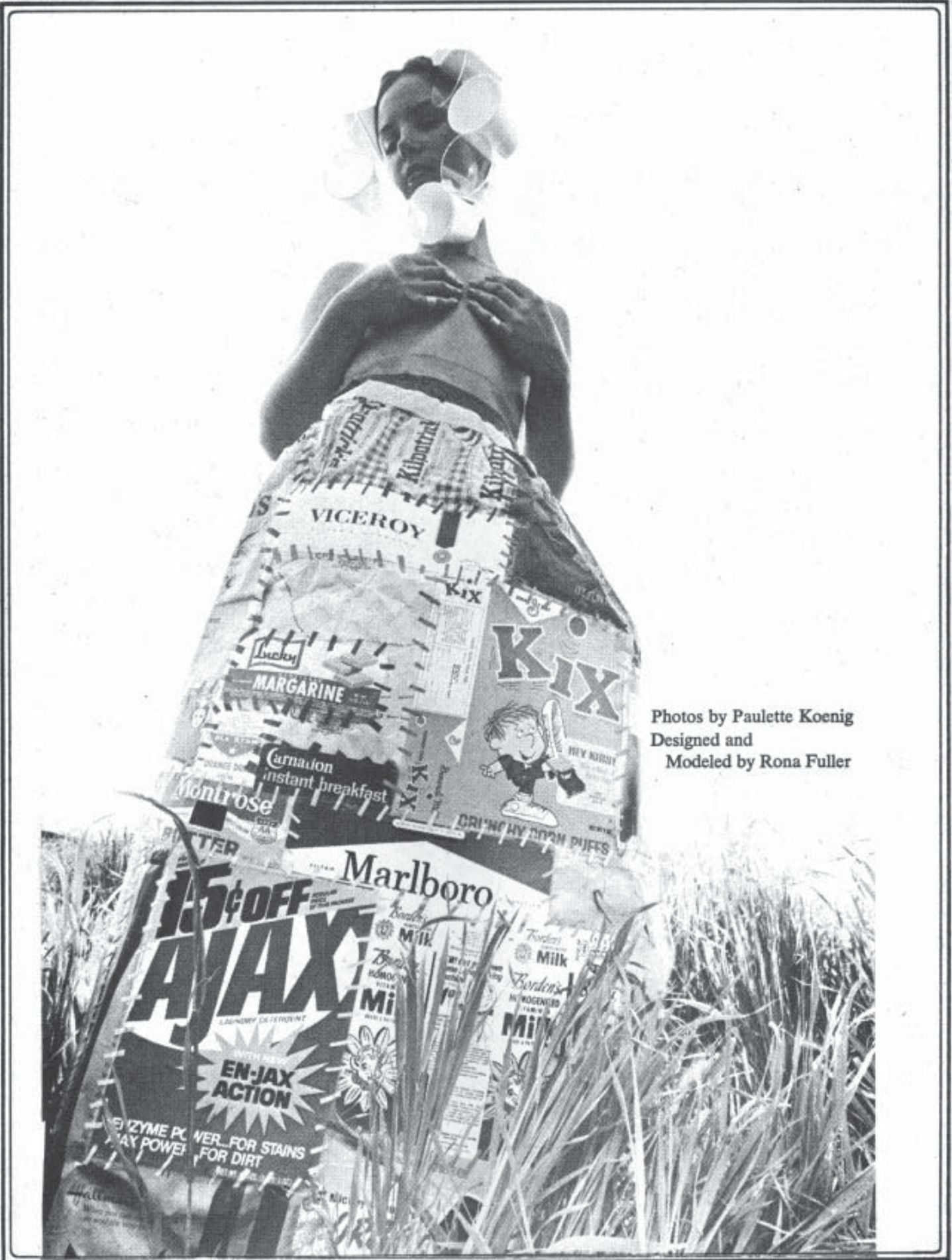
